

Message from your local councillor



My name is John West: and I have been the County Councillor for the Petersfield Division for almost 8 years.

If you are new to

home owning I am afraid that Council Tax is one of your big bills. Through it you pay for services provided by:

1) Hampshire County Council (01962 841841):

Education, Social Care, Roads, Recreation & Heritage, Libraries, Museums and Country Parks

- 2) East Hampshire District Council (01730 266551): Planning; Housing; Car Parks; Grass Cutting
- 3) **Petersfield Town Council** (01730 268241): Festival Hall; the Lake, Heath and other public open spaces.
- 4) **The Police** (non urgent matters: 08450 454545)
- 5) The Fire & Rescue Service.

The boundaries for the County Council are changing and from the next elections on the 5th May 2005 there will be 2 County Councillors, one representing the north of the Town, the other, the south.

District and Town elections will be two years later. (We are elected for 4 year terms).

Maintenance of your roads will be the responsibility of the Developer until at least 12 months after the final surfacing, and that will not be laid until the last house is built. Some completed side roads may be adopted earlier; and thus will be taken over by the County Council.

Refuse collection

Having now been out with the refuse crews on this route a couple of times they report to me that the main problem is with cars being parked on the roadways rather than in designated parking areas making maneuvering difficult due to the size of the vehicle and the grass verges. In particular on Dickins Lane. As more people move in to Ramshill this will become a worse problem unless cars are parked in the off road areas. If the vehicle cannot get round the roads the bins cannot be emptied.

It is very helpful if residents put their address on their bin - there is a sticker for this purpose in the new residents pack.

Please remember bins must be out by 7am - the lorry comes in early before the construction companies start moving large vehicles around. All bins lids must be closed and no excess refuse will be taken. Recycling must be clean, dry and loose in the bin. Extra recycling can however be collected if it is put at the side of the bin in clear sack or open box.

I know that your new housing estate would benefit from joining the Neighbourhood Watch family. Our three main aims are:-

- To prevent crime
- To reduce the fear of crime
- To promote good citizenship.

To make a start we need people to come forward as coordinators and deputies, either for a whole road, part of a road, cul-de-sac or group of houses. New coordinators have to pass a police check before being approved. The work is voluntary as a service to the community. Our lamp post signs and window stickers have proved to be an effective deterrent to crime and vandalism.

Update from Kay Blackwell the children and family worker

We run a wide variety of groups for children and families.

For pre-school children (birth to five years) there is the Fiddlesticks Music groups and the Little Fishes toddler and carer groups that run every week in term-time. At the end of each school term we also run a special service for pre-school and early years children and their families. These are mid-week services and involve story telling, singing and lots of puppets and fun, all aimed at younger children. Afterwards there is a free party for all (which in the summer is a Teddy Bears Picnic in our lovely garden!)

We have a regular Sunday School (called 'JFC') and on the third Sunday of each month we have an all-age children's service in the hall with lots of games, singing and other fun activities.

Every fortnight we run a flagdancing group (called 'FABS') for ages 8 - 15 and there is also a termtime drama club (called 'Action') for ages 6 and upwards.

For parents we are currently running a **Positive Parenting** course and in addition we run a weekly Women's Bible Study Group (with Crèche facility) and a monthly Women's Fellowship, Prayer and Praise evening.
